CHAPTER V CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS

5.1 Conclusion

The researcher conducted a study at Universitas Islam Majapahit within the English student activity unit (UKM). The focus of the research was on teaching students speaking skills using the impromptu speech method. The findings demonstrated an improvement in both the pre-test and post-test results. In Chapter 4, it was discussed that the average score before applying the teaching method (pre-test) was 12.94, while the average score after the method was implemented (post-test) increased to 17.91. This indicates an improvement in student speaking skills through the use of the impromptu speech teaching method.

The results of the data analysis were presented using a t-test, and the two-tailed significance (Sig.) value was found to be 0.00, which is less than 0.05. This signifies that the results are statistically significant. In other words, the research hypothesis (H α) is accepted. This indicates an improvement in student speaking skills through the use of the impromptu speech teaching method.

Furthermore, the validity of the questionnaire was established through calculations. The calculated r-count value was higher than the r-table value mentioned in Table 4.9. This indicates the reliability of the questionnaire data. As a result, it can be affirmed an improvement in student speaking skills through the use of the impromptu speech teaching method.
